Overview

On 12th April, Lynn Green, our Welfare Officer, paid a visit to our Wildcats and Teeny Tots sessions. She had a wonderful time catching up with parents and watching the players in action. As part of her visit, Lynn conducted a survey with attending parents to gather feedback on their experience with the sessions.

Key Findings - Wildcats

Safety & Enjoyment

- 100% of parents said they feel their daughters are safe at Wildcats.
- 100% of parents said their daughters enjoy attending Wildcats.

These responses are hugely reassuring and affirm the positive environment we strive to create for all participants.

Reasons for Attending:

- There was a 50/50 split between girls who attend for fun and those interested in eventually joining a team.

We're happy to support any players who would like to make that transition and remind you that girls can continue attending Wildcats even if they join a team elsewhere.

When asked what they love most about Wildcats, parents shared some wonderful feedback:

- A strong theme of inclusivity and a space where girls feel welcomed and confident.
- Parents appreciate that it’s a girls-only environment where players can socialise, build friendships, and grow.
- Several parents mentioned they felt welcomed from the very first session, which is exactly what we aim for.

There was also a lot of praise for our dedicated coaches, all of whom are volunteers giving up their Saturday mornings to support the players. It's great to see their efforts recognised and appreciated.

Suggestions for Improvement

While most feedback was very positive, a couple of helpful suggestions were shared:

- Parents expressed interest in more group trips, especially to watch live football matches – something we will explore for future planning.
- One comment mentioned that not all games seem football-related. Just to reassure you: every game we play is designed to support football development in some way. If you're ever unsure, please do speak to a coach or volunteer — they'll be happy to explain the purpose behind each activity.
